WHO WE ARE

We are a Christian homeschool cooperative that serves as "Homeschool Support". We combine the benefits of classroom learning and the joys and freedom of homeschooling. As a ministry of Access Church, we serve families who want an individualized education option that provides the community we need and high-quality, Christ-centered academic instruction.

Educationally, spiritually, physically...the **WHOLE CHILD** is being developed in an encouraging and God-honoring atmosphere.

OUR MISSION

We partner with families to build bridges connecting our Creator (God), calling (who we are in Christ and what we are called to do for His Kingdom), and community (the spheres of influence we have with the people around us).



HYBRID MODEL

Our students spend five and a half hours a day for 3 days a week on campus. During the school days, teachers cover a full range of subjects including, but not limited to: Chapel/Devotions/Worship, Claritas Memory Work, Bible, Language Arts (reading, writing, grammar, handwriting & copy work), Math, History/Geography, & Science (ie. nature study, field study, and outdoor play).

The other two days of the week are spent focusing at a minimum on literacy and math skills. The older your children are, the more subjects you may choose to include at home. You will receive ideas for assignments to complete on the home days based on the curricula we have chosen for Hybrid. There is flexibility on home days in that parents can customize their lessons to fit their child's learning style and pursue interest-based studies. Home days give parents a chance to be involved in their child's education, tailor the lessons to their child's needs, and help provide continuity between school and home days.

We ask that you do your best to be sure your child is getting practice with comparable math and reading and writing so that they can participate in class comfortably.

Please understand that State College Access Church Hybrid Co-op is a non-profit educational organization, not a legal school. You are responsible for reporting your child to the state as a legal homeschooler. While we are here to support you as much as we can, complying with state regulations for reporting and testing is ultimately up to the parent. We've adopted the concept of Big Rocks, Little Rocks at Access Hybrid. The big rocks are the things that are really important to us and take priority over other things. The pebbles and sand are the not-so-important, smaller tasks that that we often fill our time with.

Imagine having an empty jar (your life, business, or ministry).



If the sand and pebbles (small, not-so-important, low priority tasks) go in the jar first, there won't be enough room for the big rocks (really important, high priority things).



If we start with the big rocks in the jar first, we create space for what's most important and the smaller tasks can fill in the spaces in between.

FRIDAY CO-OP

FRIDAYS FROM 9:30am to 11:30am

Friday Co-Op is separate from the Hybrid Co-Op and is a day the whole family attends. Fridays are optional for Hybrid families. Friday Co-Op is not a drop off option. Parents are expected to stay from 9:30-11:30. Below is a list of possible Friday Co-Op electives K-8th students can choose from each session; 2 classes per session throughout the year.

Hybrid high school students (9th-12th) can choose from the following electives depending on level of interest.

There are 6 sessions of electives so students can have a variety of classes to choose from each semester. Each session lasts 4 weeks. In addition to electives there are field trips, holiday parties, and end-of-year celebration.

HYBRID FAOS

1. How do students transition from a different educational setting (public, private, exclusively homeschooled) to this hybrid model?

While individual experiences differ, we have seen that students adjust with ease socially. Our small class sizes and warm, loving, Christian community contribute to children quickly feeling like 'part of the family' here. We do not strictly follow a classical model, yet we have adopted many of the classical methods of education (ie: memory work). This may seem new and different to students coming from traditional public and private schools but our teachers work hand in hand with students and their families to make this a smooth transition academically.

2. I want to register my child/children for Access Hybrid...now what?

- Your family will have a one on one meeting with our team of directors so that we can get to know more about you and your children. This may include an academic assessment if our directors determine it is necessary for appropriate classroom placement. We also like to meet with you to make sure our program is a good fit for you and your family.

3. What is a typical day like at Access Hybrid?

- Arrival time is 8:50am-9:00am. Students start the day together with chapel time which includes worship time and prayer. This time is also used for a rotating schedule of devotions, guest speakers and memory work instruction and review.
- Students have a daily schedule that includes Bible, math, language arts, history and science. (Science is on a rotating schedule in K-4 classes). They also enjoy a one hour break for both lunch (sent from home) and recess. We place a high priority on outside play and strive to go outdoors for every recess.
- Dismissal is at 2:30pm each day of hybrid.

4. What curriculum do you use?

• We utilize a variety of educationally sound curriculum choices to develop a heart of wisdom through spiritual, character and academic training. We want to cultivate joyful learning as a lifestyle and raise great thinkers who question and seek truth. Some examples of our curriculum choices include Institute for Excellence in Writing (IEW), Story of the World, Claritas and Teaching Textbooks.

5. How are students evaluated?

Students are given mid-year assessments. Each student is required to submit a portfolio of the progress from the year to an evaluator. We utilize a platform called QuickSchools to keep parents informed of their children's assignment completion. To meet Pennsylvania homeschool requirements, 3rd, 5th, and 8th grade students will take standardized tests in the spring.

6. Is there busing?

 All transportation is provided by the family, but many families privately work out carpooling from several neighboring towns!
